Introduction

The Bracknell Gallery at South Hill Park is pleased to host this exhibition which brings together a number of British Printmakers and Graphic Fine Artists. All of these artists are committed to the use of new technologies while retaining an awareness, interest and practice in the more traditional areas of printmaking.

Printmaking has been a principal source of expression for many British artists. It has also been an area of much change over the last decade; new technologies have led to a reappraisal and convergence of media and working methods used by artists.

The origin of this exhibition was born in Canterbury in 1994 in the new and exciting area of Graphic Fine Art within Canterbury College of Art, Kent Institute of Art and Design. This has developed into a visionary investigation into the future role of printmaking.
